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## No Child Left Inside!

### Inspire the Next Generation of Environmental Stewards

Due to the heavy focus on math and reading testing in our nation's schools as a result of the No Child Left Behind law, many students are no longer being taught basic environmental education. Teachers, who previously taught students the importance of clean air and water and the threat of global warming, are now focusing their efforts strictly on issues that will be tested, and the environment isn't on the list. The "teaching to the test" requirements have also (in many cases) excluded field trips to nature centers or other outdoor activities, which have the potential of opening young minds and eyes.

U.S. Senator Jack Reed (D-RI) and U.S. Representative John Sarbanes (D-MD) want to reenergize environmental education in our schools. They have introduced the **No Child Left Inside Act in the House (H.R. 3036) and Senate (S. 1981)**, which would provide new **federal funding** for environmental education and give states incentives to improve environmental instruction and teacher training. The No Child Left Behind law is due to be reauthorized in Congress; Senator Reed and Representative Sarbanes are working to have the provisions of the No Child Left Inside Act incorporated into that legislation.

Provisions of the No Child Left Inside Act include:

- The requirement that states seeking environmental education funding under No Child Left Behind develop and submit a K-12 plan to ensure that high school graduates are environmentally literate. States receiving such funds would submit status reports on how those plans are being implemented.
- The provision for new funding for states to develop, improve and advance environmental education standards.
- New funding to train qualified teachers to teach environmental education courses and programs.





At a time when the nation and the world face major environmental challenges, it is crucial that our next generation of students receive the education and tools they need to tackle these challenges head on. Many of us can remember our first school field trip to a nature center and how those experiences shaped who we are today; it is essential that we share these values with our children.

More than 170 groups are strongly supporting the No Child Left Inside Coalition, including the Sierra Club, the National Wildlife Federation, and the Audubon Society, the North American Association for Environmental Education and now BEMP!


